NEW WARD BOUNDARIES EFFECTIVE 1/1/2012

Statewide Redistricting efforts are now completed and some local residents reside in a new ward due to boundary lines shifting. Prior to the Feb. Spring Primary Election the City Clerk's Office will inform local residents what ward they now reside in. **A boundary map is displayed on pages 2 & 3 of this newsletter.** Marinette has three established polling sites with Wards 1, 3 & 5 voting at the NWTC/WI Job Center site, Wards 2, 4 & 6 voting at Marinette High School and Wards 7 & 8 voting at Duer Gym. The 2012 Spring Election cycle will include a Spring Primary Election (if required) on Tuesday Feb. 21, 2011 and a Spring General an Presidential Preference Vote Election on Tuesday April 3, 2012. The 2012 Fall Election cycle includes a Fall Partisan Primary Election on Tuesday August 14, 2012 and a Fall General Election on Tuesday Nov. 6, 2012.

NEW TAX PAYMENT OPTION

Marinette County Treasurer, Bev Noffke, is pleased to announce the County is proceeding with the final phase of a tax collection agreement "test program" with Bank Mutual and Nicolet National Bank that will allow property owners the option of paying their first half or full property tax payments at the following branch offices: **Bank Mutual** (two locations) at 830 Pierce Ave. and Pine Tree Mall Branch at 2314 Roosevelt Road; **Nicolet National Bank**, at 2009 Hall Avenue, The banks will not be able to receive any tax payments from tax payers who have delinquent taxes from 2010 or prior years, as those must be made at the Marinette County Treasurers office. Additionally, they will not be able to collect any personal property taxes. Payments are still accepted at the Marinette County Treasurers office in person or by mail at 1926 Hall Ave., Marinette, WI 54143. If the "test program" runs smoothly, all banks in Marinette County will be offered an opportunity to enter into the same type of agreement for future tax collection periods, beginning with July 2012 collections.

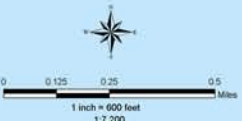
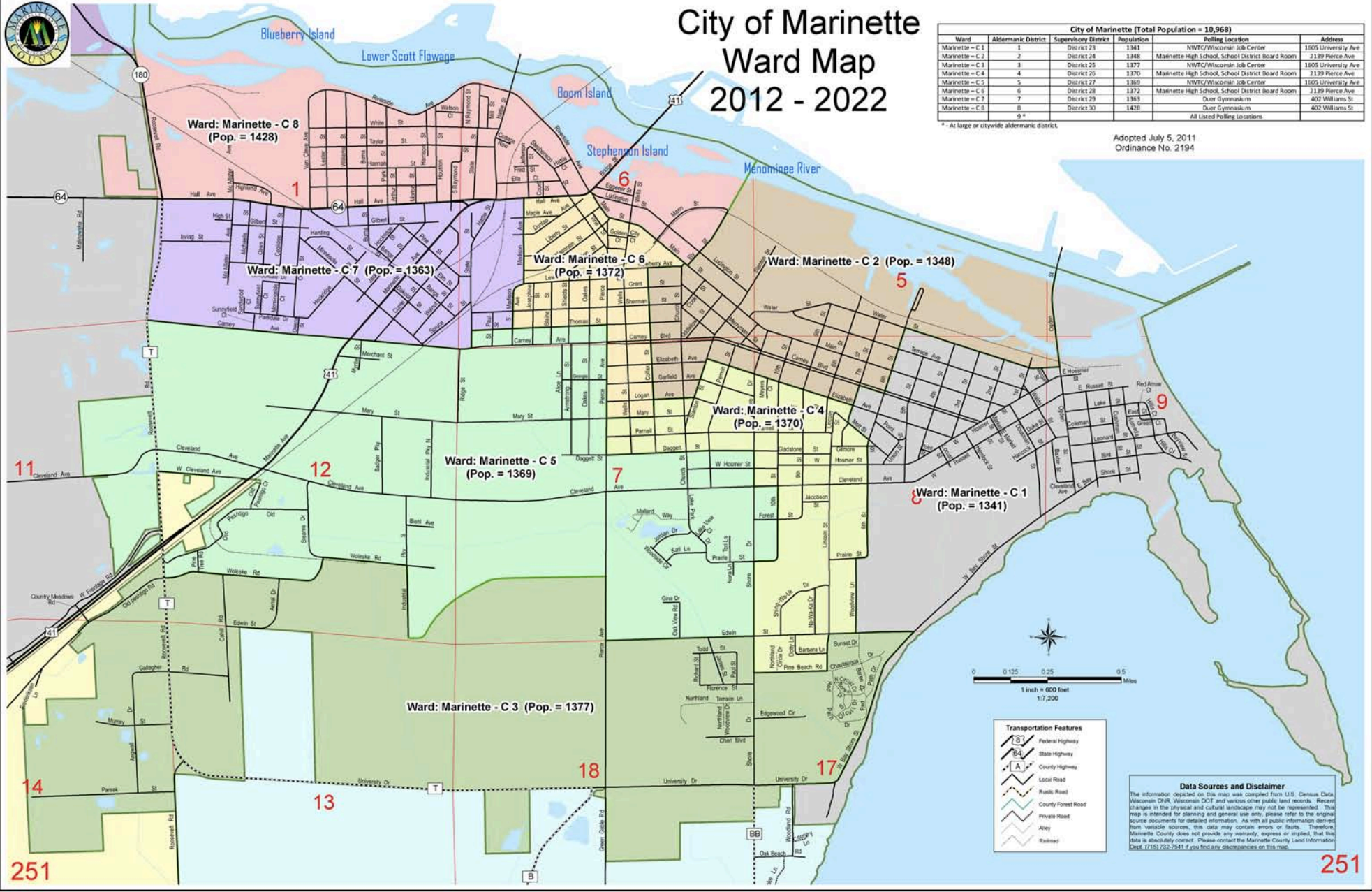


City of Marinette Ward Map 2012 - 2022
