2. **Upon a call of the roll** it was determined a quorum of committee members were present and the following attendance was recorded:

3. **Approve Public Safety and Code Enforcement Committee Meeting minutes.**  
Alderpersons Walters moved/Noppenberg seconded (Flatt abstained) and motion to approve, as submitted, the City of Marinette Public Safety and Code Enforcement Committee regular meeting minutes from 11/20/17.
4. **Police Department activity report.**  
Police Chief Mabry prepared and included within today's meeting agenda packet the Marinette Police Department's activity/operations report showing 12-month comparative prior and current year-to-date activity/call totals through today's date. Alderperson Walters asked if Chief Mabry could report to the Committee regarding the Draeger Machine which test for the presents of Narcotics that may be in a person's system and how often it is used.
5. **Fire Department activity report.**  
Fire Chief Heckel prepared and included within today's meeting agenda packet the Marinette Fire Department's activity/operations report through today's date.
6. **Building, Plumbing and Electrical Code Inspection activity reports.**  
Municipal Building, Plumbing & Electrical Code Inspector/SAFEbuilt, LLC, Representative Ruechel prepared and included in today's meeting agenda packet his building inspection office activity report showing current and prior year comparative year-to-date data through November 2017 of various permits and inspections completed by the Building Code Inspector's Office.
7. **Municipal Code/Humane Officer's activity report.**  
Municipal Code/Humane Officer Cherry prepared and included in today's meeting agenda packet her Office's Animal Control activity report showing comparative prior and current year-to-date (through November 2017) detail of Department calls she received for various stray animals including dogs, cats, raccoons, skunks, deer and other animals along with documented reports of animals biting humans. Officer Cherry also included separate reports listing non-compliant property owners with property upkeep issues.

The proposed agreement is for 3 years with a Ninety 90 day opt out for either party. Alderperson Hitt moved/Flatt seconded and all concurred to recommend the Common Council approve the professional Services Agreement with SAFEbuilt Wisconsin, LLC.

Chief Heckel reported to the committee the specifics of the Memorandum and handed out at the meeting a Summary of EMS calls made to Marinette County Dispatch. This agenda item was for informational purposes and no action was taken. Chief Heckel was asked to provide an additional summary to his monthly Fire Department reports regarding the calls responded to within the new area.
10. **Discussion regarding facility needs for the Police Department.**  
The committee would like this added to the January 15<sup>th</sup> meeting and have Chief Mabry along with the Public Safety & Code Enforcement committee do a walk thru in the PD, and have Chief Mabry devise a report that lists needs and deficiencies of the PD Department.

On December 6th I attended an "EMS Huddle" sponsored by Aurora BayCare Medical Center. The topic was on Pre-Hospital Care of Oncology Patients. CEU's were awarded towards National Registry re-certification.

On December 7<sup>th</sup> I attended "Pediatric Emergencies" and "Stop the Bleeding" training at Crivitz High School.

On December 13<sup>th</sup> another walk thru was conducted of the new BAMC hospital to stay up to date with construction progress.

On December 15<sup>th</sup> I completed my Ice/Cold Water Rescue technician Certification training. Practical skills testing was done at the new Menekaunee Boat Launch.

On December 19<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> completed annual Haz-Mat Physical. The physical involved blood work, respiratory function, hearing, vision, EKG, and general physical per NFPA guidelines.

On December 20<sup>th</sup> I witnessed a "hydro test" of a portion of the sprinkler system at the new BAMC.

Throughout the month of December, department calendars were handed out to supporting businesses in Marinette.

On December 25<sup>th</sup> Lt. Timblin and I conducted a fire investigation at the scene of a trailer fire located at 2430 Mary St., lot 85. Due to the condition of the trailer post fire the cause is listed as undetermined at this time.

On December 27<sup>th</sup> Lt. Timblin and I along with Town of Peshtigo Fire Department Chief Mike Folgert, who is part of the Marinette County Arson Task Force, investigated a fire that occurred at 1555 Thomas St.



the Area of origin was determined to be in the attic and the cause undetermined but believed to be electrical in nature.

The Memorandum of Understanding for city wide EMS coverage is nearing completion. We are waiting for the new Medical Control Doctor to take over to obtain his signature.

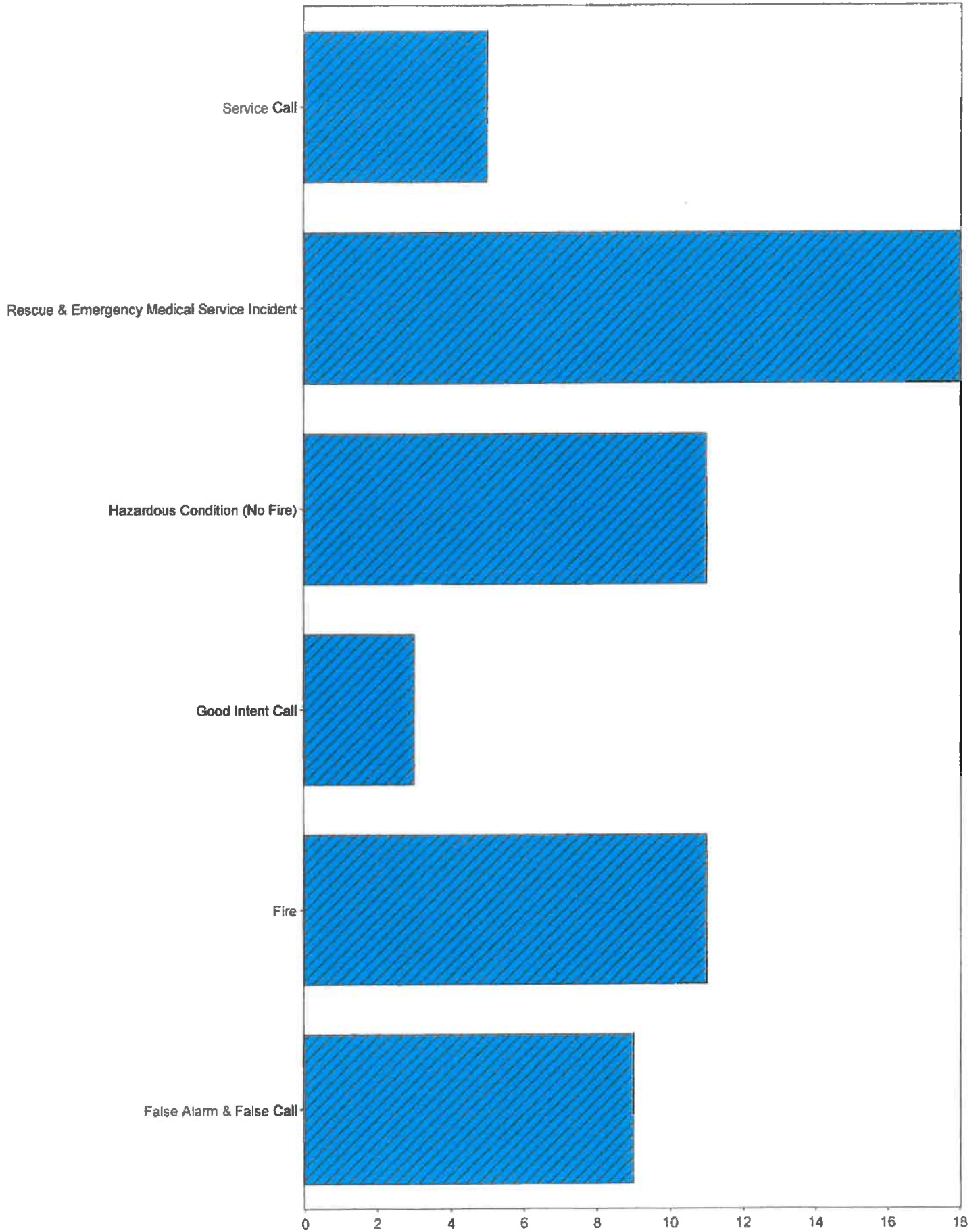
