Activity Report of the Fire Chief for December 2018

December 1 marked the start of the 2018 "Keep It Green" campaign. The program is a visual reminder to think fire safety through the hustle and bustle of the holiday season.

On December 3 I completed an online CFI Trainer.NET Module on "Understanding Undetermined" for arson investigation.

On December 4 the on duty crew, City Building Inspector, and I inspected the Grinsteiner property at 1705 Main St. The building is currently vacant and has no utilities in service. We discussed keeping exits unblocked and making sure to seal window openings that had broken or missing glass.

On December 5 I attended the pre-launch meeting for LCS-19 at FMM. Plans for the launch and coverage by public safety agencies were reviewed.

On December 5 A.C. Pecard and I met with Tom Carow of FNN to discuss testing of fire hose used by the fire department that is kept on site and upcoming drills.

On December 5 Aladdin Fire Protection did annual fire extinguisher inspections and the six month inspection of the department's hood system.

On December 5 preparations for the city network upgrade were made at the station. New cables were run for computer work stations and a computer equipment cabinet was installed by the duty crew.

On December 5 Marinette County Dispatcher Sara Hensly spent time at the station to learn our operations and apparatus. This is part of a training initiative coordinated by the Communications Director so dispatchers see what happens on the other side of the radio.

On December 8 and 9 I attended an EMT refresher at the Marinette ERS building. The instruction was through NWTC and was 16 hours of the required 32 for refresher hours.

On December 12 I attended the meeting of the Marinette County Hazard Mitigation Plan committee at the Law Enforcement Center. The critical infrastructure list and Chapters 1 & 2 of the plan were reviewed and changes suggested. The Plan assesses risks and evaluates the community vulnerability from potential hazards, both natural and man-made.

Also on December 12 the Building Inspector and I met with the owner of LaCabana to review and check the progress of compliance issues for a permanent occupancy permit to be issued. All areas of concern were corrected.

On December 13 I attended the Safety Meeting held at City Hall. The recent fire drill was reviewed and other areas of concern were identified and discussed, emergency exiting and power outages being among the items discussed.

On December 13 the officers of the Marinette County MABAS Division 144 attended a meeting of the Menominee County Fire Chiefs to answer questions about and discuss the benefits of MABAS with its members.

On December 15 the department served as the Incident Command Center for the launch of LCS-19. Motorcade and FMM visitor entrance monitoring was also conducted by department personnel.

On December 15 and 16 I completed the second 16 hours of my EMT refresher held at the Marinette ERS building.

On December 15 F.F. Levi Sanborn graduated with Honors from the Fox Valley Technical College with an Associates Degree in Fire Science, fulfilling the promise he made when he was hired. F.F. Sanborn completed his schooling while working as a full time Fire Fighter for the City of Marinette. I applaud his hard work and dedication.

On December 17 I had a phone conference with TAPCO regarding traffic pre-emption on Marinette traffic control lights that currently do not have the system.



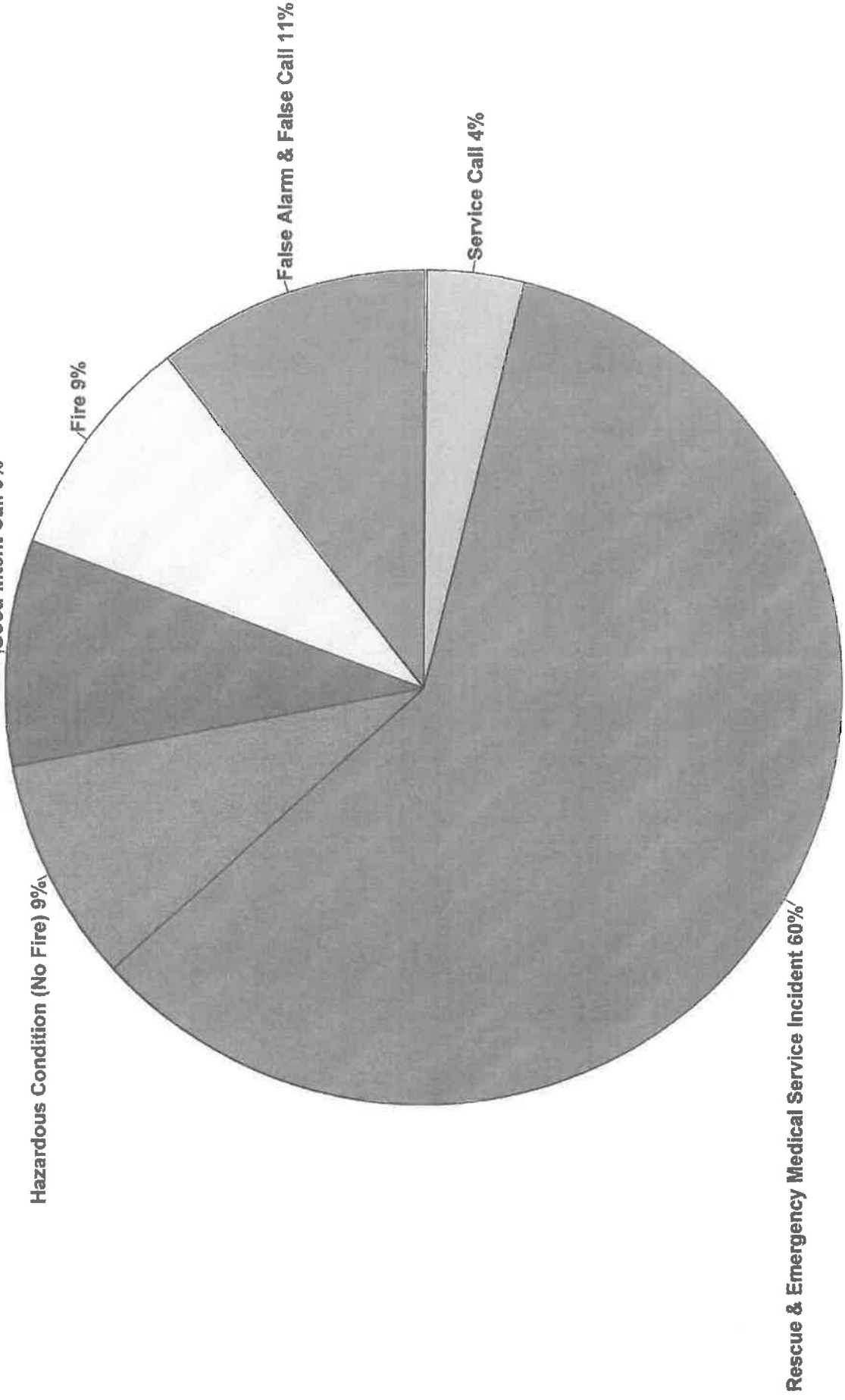
