Directors Report – February 2019

REC Center - Our move to the new REC center on the 25th of January was a total success. The grand openings were very successful attended by many. Positive comments have been by all who toured the facility. Everyone is amazed at the huge spaces that are available. The comment we hear most is "We are so lucky to have this in our community "

Ice Rink - Attendance at open skate has been strong. Birthday parties and Ice rentals continue to be in demand. Several seniors have taken advantage of our special Senior Skate time from 8am – noon for only \$1. Our Noon Hour skate is extremely popular. We have 18 children enrolled in skating lessons in our current session. Everyone is enjoying the new rink.

Turf – Attendance in the turf arena has exceeded our expectations. The recent school closings have presented an opportunity for everyone to experience the versatility of this new addition. We have had pick up soccer games, kickball, football, and even disc golf putting competition. As of February 7th we have registered 230 walkers. It is really nice to see a dozen walkers while 50 kids play at the same time.

Aquatics – We are very pleased to have 12 new students enrolled in our lifeguard certification program.

Special Events –

- **Fly Fishing for Trout** begins on **February 19th** at the new REC center in meeting room 121 for all instructional classes this year. The final class practicing live casting will be done in the Activity hall on March 12th. We have 6 people registered so far.
- **American Girl(R) Tea Party** – on February 2nd was sold out with 24 patrons. It was received so well that we are planning another event in the future.
- **Toddler Time** – began on January 31st in the turf center. On February 7th we had 72 moms, dads & kids taking part in the bounce house, running and playing.

Activity Hall – The painting and striping of the activity hall is almost complete. We hope to open soon.


